“Border Security Requirements Subcommittee”

Tasking from the ALC Chair (C2):

“In preparation for the possibility of a Homeland Security bill, CBP should take proactive steps to refresh and rearticulate its requirements. This effort will be led by the Operations Support Office, supported by the Office of Acquisitions, who will coordinate with appropriate CBP offices to define scope and process.”

Further refinement on scope from EAC (b) (6), (b) (7)(C) e-mail to EACs:

“Potential items for this bill should include: border technology and infrastructure, including critical air and marine capabilities; agent and officer mobility; humanitarian response plan/initiative; expanding intelligence capabilities; and critical port infrastructure.”

- FY 2018-2022 RAP Items
- FY 2017 Conference Engagement Strategy Items
- Commissioner’s FY 2017 Priorities (includes capabilities and multi-year outcomes) and Vision and Strategy 2020
- Air and Marine briefing to ALC, September 2016
- Prior Comprehensive Immigration Reform bills into which CBP had input
- Presidential Transition Issue Papers (as applicable)
