#### STATEMENT OF WORK (SOW) FOR THE Small Unmanned Aircraft System (SUAS)

##### **A. AUTHORITY**

Economy Act of 1932 (31 U.S.C. 1535) with additional requirements for this Act in Federal Acquisition Regulation (FAR), 48 CFR 17.5. Others include: The Homeland Security Act of 2002 P.L. 107-296 Sec. 309; The Government Management Reform Act of 1994 (31 U.S.C. 501); Government Employees Training Act (5 U.S.C. 4104); and the Office of Personnel Management Revolving Fund (5 U.S.C. 1304(e)(1)).

##### **B. OBJECTIVE/PURPOSE**

This agreement is between the U.S. Customs and Border (CBP), Office of Air and Marine and the 670 AESS, Battlefield Airmen Program Office for the acquisition, integrated logistical support and maintenance support of the Small Unmanned Aircraft System (SUAS) also known as the Battlefield Air Targeting Micro Air Vehicle (BATMAV).

This agreement will establish the requirement for acquiring Small Unmanned Aircraft Systems through a contract between the U.S. Air Force Special Operations Command and Aerovironment. The contract is for the acquisition, integration, logistical support and maintenance for up to (20) twenty rugged, field-repairable, man-packable, single-operators, hand-launched unmanned aircraft system over multiple years. CBP A&M plans to initially purchase (b) (4) SUAS to confirm the operating limits for the environments in which A&M operates; verify system performance; validate or create missionized checklist and flight manual supplements; and, recommend equipment list and aircraft configuration.

##### **C. SCOPE**

The goal of this program is to deliver and support a rugged, field-repairable, man-pack able, single-operator, hand-launched unmanned aircraft system (UAS) that provides real-time intelligence, surveillance reconnaissance (ISR) and damage assessment. The 670 AESS, Battlefield Airmen Program Office agrees to acquire the SUAS through a contract between the U.S. Air Force Special Operations Command and Aerovironment.

**Task 1**

Acquire (b) (4) Small Unmanned Aircraft Systems to confirm the operating limits for the environments in which A&M operates; ver system performance; validate or create missionized checklist flight manual supplements; and, recommend equipment list and aircraft configuration. CBP A & M agrees to fund all costs, both nonrecurring and recurring associated with the acquisition, integration, qualification and integration of mission equipment packages.
